HOSTING A PRIVATE EXHIBITION

Step 1: Plan the Logistics

Date and Time: Consider weekends or evenings when more people are likely to attend.

Space Arrangement: Decide which areas of your home will be used for displaying artwork. Make sure there is enough space for guests to move around comfortably while viewing artworks.

Artwork Display: Discuss with Jane how she would like works displayed. This may include hanging pieces on walls, using easels or creating designated areas for different types of artworks. Jane will provide easels.

Step 2: Promote the Event

Artist Interaction: Encourage guests to interact with the artist. This can lead to meaningful conversations. Jane will do a speech explaining her artworks, technique and creative process.

Feedback Collection: Consider having a guest book where attendees can leave comments about their favourite pieces or thoughts on the exhibition.

Step 5: Follow Up After the Event

Thank You Cards: Jane will supply cards.

Sales Follow-Up: If any artwork was sold during the exhibition, facilitate communication between buyer and the artist regarding payment and delivery.
